National Negro Health Week laid the foundation for National Minority Health Month 100 years ago. Dr. Booker T. Washington took the lead.

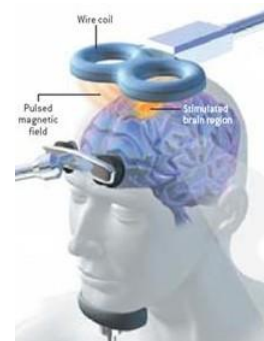

➤ **Electromagnetic Head Device Helps Treat Veterans Battling Depression** - It's not just Veterans who are at risk of depression, as 11,887 active duty service members received a diagnosis between January and May of 2016 alone. That number adds to the 774,000 Veterans who received a possible diagnosis of major depression in 2016. The VA is providing a new option to help fight the disorder called Repetitive Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation, or rTMS therapy. It's a device that uses an electromagnet charged with electricity that is applied to specific points on the patient's head. The powerful magnetic field can then affect the brain cells of the person suffering from depression. VA purchased 40 rTMS devices to be distributed at facilities across the country. Staff Psychiatrist at White River Junction VA Medical Center, Paul E. Holtzheimer, MD, said "Repetitive Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (rTMS) is very safe and well-tolerated. I think that it should be considered when treating Veterans for depression who have not responded to anti-depressant medications." [Read More](#)

The study "D-Cycloserine: A Novel Treatment for Gulf War Illness" consists of 6 visits including an initial screen for qualification. Those qualifying will receive either D-Cycloserine or a placebo at the next visit. Participants are asked to take the study drug for 28 days and asked to check in several times while on the medication at which times questionnaires will be given testing memory and attention with a one month follow-up visit.
